Area Off Coronado Declared 'Naval Danger Zone'

A 206-acre area offshore from Coronado was designated Wednesday by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers as a "Naval Danger Zone" off-limits to boaters when a small arms range is in use at Naval Air Station North Island. The fan-shaped zone, which was established to protect the public from munitions that could ricochet into the Pacific Ocean during small arms firing, extends offshore from NAS North Island, near the entrance to San Diego Bay, just south of the Zuniga Jetty, according to the Army Corps of Engineers. During live fire exercises, boats will be required to vacate the area.

The Navy will notify boaters when the firing range is in use through radio communication, a Web site, warning flags and flashing red lights, according to the Army Corps of Engineers. Capt. Yancy Lindsey, commanding officer of Naval Base Coronado, said the firing range at NAS North Island plays an important role in training Navy personnel, and the zone is necessary to guarantee public safety.

"We worked closely with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and members of the public to understand the multi-use nature of the waters off of North Island and establish the danger zone to protect the public and military during range use," he said. The danger zone will be open to fishing and general navigation when no weapons' firing is scheduled.

July Month long Tournament

JULY MONTH LONG TOURNAMENT RESULTS AND NEWS

Hello anglers, the July month long tournament had entries who could have won in the bay, off-shore, or up to 125 miles from San Diego.

Of those who weighed in fish, Ted Phoenix had the highest points with a 26.8 pound albacore worth 107.2 points and 1st place in the adult division.

2nd place Bill Davidson (and the rest of his crew will follow) caught a 4.5 Sand bass for 99 points.

3rd place John Nakatani with a 4.3 Sand bass for 94.6 points.

4th place Thomas Villergas with a 3.8 Sand bass for 83.6 points.

The junior division was won by Jennifer Nakatani with a 3.7 Sand bass for 81.4 points. Congratulations to all.

No summer, cold water, no fish. Scattered Yellowtail and some White Sea bass. Pretty much sums up this year on the water. Tough fishing. The August tournament was canceled due to lack of participation, it's no surprise, tough fishing.

The end of August brings a new month and hopefully new news on the fishing front. The September tournament? Catfish? Trout? I'll go out on a limb and be optimistic, Tuna. Err, Sand bass. I mean Yellowtail. Maybe Marlin. Ah screw it. Enter September's tournament, go out to the ocean and catch a fish. then bring it to the weigh in and eat some of John's BBQ. Sounds like a plan to me.

Where have all the fish gone?

Well if you're like me, you have not been doing too much fishing this summer. At least not tuna fishing. As I look at the dock counts each evening and see the fish counts, or lack of, I have to ask myself, where have all fish gone? This is the month of August, and is usually prime time to go fishing for Yellowtail, Yellowfin, Bluefin and Dorado. Instead we are fishing for rockfish. What's up with that?

Well if you have not heard, we have an unusual patch of cold water (58 to 62 degrees) off southern California that is almost the size of the U.S. What was suppose to be an El Niño summer, with warm-water conditions, turned into a cold-water La Niña summer. Plus with the jet stream dipping well south of normal summertime patterns, plus the continuing cloud cover hugging the coast, the water and air temperature is well below normal. Can someone ask the environmentalist about global warming?

So don't sell your boat yet. The water is starting to show some signs of improvement, so who knows this may a late fishing season, and we may be fishing into November. On August 16 there were a few boats fishing outside San Martin Island catching some bluefin and yellowfin tuna. The counts are not the greatest, but it might be the start of a late season rally.



Bill Schneider and grandson, Christopher Hume had a Sand Bass derby and Christopher topped Grandpa with a huge 5.5 lb bass while Bill landed a 5.4 lb bass while fishing at South Coronado Island. Dave Morgan takes over top honors for the club's largest Corbina with a nice 3.5 lb'r. Steve Ross reported a 3.7 lb Calico Bass and a sweet 4.7 lb Vermillion and added to his All-Around Angler totals. Steve's wife, Gail, landed a 3.5 lb Rockfish to add to her totals as well. Millie Velez was also busy with a 13.1 lb Halibut, a 3.6 lb Barracuda and a 2.6 lb Rockfish to take over the lead in the Women's division for the All-Around Angler. 
