



Colin Jones, with Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission (PSMFC) Wednesday, July 5th, 2017

Colin Jones, a fisheries biologist with Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission (PSMFC), will present information on the status of groundfish in the Southern California Bight. Colin has multiple years of experience working directly with the fishing industry to help improve data collection for groundfish stocks.

Over the last 14 years, an annual hook and line research survey has taken place in southern California with NOAA, PSMFC, and the local sportfishing industry. Learn how local Commercial Passenger Fishing Vessels (CPFVs) play an integral role in survey operations, and how the data collected improves stock assessments for groundfish.

Colin will also discuss how the hook and line survey is utilizing a towedcamera sled to collect habitat information, as well as recent survey sampling within the Cowcod Conservation Areas (CCAs).

several nicer bass, with a fat 7.5lb Calico taking big fish honors for angler Kyle Hernandez. The Junior Anglers answered the call with several nice keeper bass as well. 1st place junior angler Gavin Terpining received \$30.00, 2nd place went to Steven Redondo with a \$20.00 score and 3rd place junior angler Riley Childs took home a \$10.00.



San Diego Anglers ³/₄-day Charter on June 25, 2017 By: Dwayne Patenaude

Our trip started like any other, Dwayne checking us in and making sure all was set for another great fishing trip. We headed for the islands, chasing Yellowtail, Bonito, and bass. Ryan, the captain, of the San Diego went in search of good water to look for Yellowtail northwest of the Islands. Ryan said the water had cooled by 3 degrees, to 60, and was not good for Yellowtail, so he turned back towards the Islands.

With no bites in the middle grounds, we continued the search. South kelp proved to be no better, with bad water and temps. Ryan made the call to head offshore for some rock cod. We set up on the reef and on our first drop was to 300-plus feet, which needed 16oz of weight to get down. This stop produced some very nice Reds, Bocaccio and other bottom dwellers. We made 3 passes on this reef and fill our sacks.

With reports of some larger grade Bluefin tuna offshore, Ryan headed out to see if we could get into a tug of war or two. The crew set up the kite and dropped back a blue and silver Yummy-Flyer, while metering several schools of good sized tuna. It happened. We were hooked on the Yummy-flyer and it was game on. First angler on the rod was Renee Lester, with her son Kyle backing her up. This was a tag team event with other anglers assisting; Gloria Pollard and Wyatt Cargel worked hard to get this fish close to the boat, and Bob Rollins brought it to the rail. Ryan and his crew successfully boated our first 100lb-plus Bluefin.

With one fish in the hold and a few more hours before we had to head for home, the crew had us set up and flying the Yummy again. Earl Asbury's number was pulled out of the hat, so he was first up on the next hookup. Flying a kite with a Yummy isn't as easy was one would think, Ryan's crew worked hard to get it setup up right. With a few resets we were fishing again. We hooked up again as a tuna crashed the flyer, Earl was up, this fish seemed more determined to use all the rail. Earl's brother, Ed, and Mike Taylor tag teamed this tuna and about 45 minutes later it was on the deck, game over. Nice ending to a day of fishing with fellow anglers.

July Charters

We have 4 charters this month: one twilight and three, 3/4-day trips (one on the "Liberty" and two on the "Vendetta." <u>If you</u> are signed up for any of the charters, please bring your payment to the meeting.

The twilight trip will be the same as the previous ones: Meet at Seaforth Landing at 5:15 pm on Friday, July 7th. Bring one rod with about 15 lb test and all your favorite lures. We hope the bass will bite as good on this one as they did the last!!! Cost is \$10 for adult members and kids fish for free.

Next up is a midweek charter on the "<u>Vendetta" out of H&M Landing</u>, Thursday, July 13. Trip is full right now, but I can put a couple of names on the standby list. Cost is \$140 plus FMM (\$30 the morning of the trip). Passport or Passport Card is required. Please be at H&M Landing at 4:30 am. Please bring no more than 3 rods as there are only 36 rod holders on the boat for us to use. Mexican fishing license is also needed on this trip as we are scheduled to go to the Islands.

The following **Thursday**, **July 20th**, we have our first charter on the "<u>Liberty" out of Fisherman's Landing</u>. Please be at the Landing at 4:45 am. Cost is \$140 plus FMM that morning. This is a much larger boat than we have chartered before, with a full service galley, lots of room to eat, 2 showers and 40 bunks to sleep in on the way out and in! Passport or passport card is required on this trip as it is also scheduled to fish the Islands.

The last charter will be another 3/4 day trip on the "<u>Vendetta</u>" on <u>Sunday</u>, July 30. Everything is the same as the above "Vendetta" charter except the date.

RULES AND ENTRY FORM

- 1. The official starting time of the tournament is 06:00 am on Saturday, July 22nd, 2017. The official ending time of the tournament is 5:00 pm on Saturday, July 22nd, 2017. Weigh in between 4:00 pm thru 5:00 pm.
- 2. Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time. All club tournaments are operated on an honor system.
- 3. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be limited to those waters of the Pacific Ocean within 125 miles of San Diego.
- 4. During the tournament, fishing can be done from any fishing platform, including Sportfishing boats.
- 5. Bait may be caught, purchased, or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used, or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
- 6. IGFA angling rules will be used for this tournament. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance with all California or Mexican fishing and boating laws and regulations, as applicable.
- 7. Transferring of anglers and fish from a disabled boat is allowed to comply with Rule #8 or to continue to fight a hooked fish.
- 8. All fish must be weighed on the club scale between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM at the San Diego Anglers Tournament Weigh Station located at the SOUTH SHORES LAUNCH RAMP in Mission Bay.
- 9. Species: Bass, Barracuda, & Bonita. Entrants can weigh only one fish from each species.
- 10. Cash Prizes will be awarded in the following categories: Heaviest Sack Weight 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place for adults; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for juniors. Regardless of weight, 3B's beats 2B's and 2B's beats 1B. There will be no ties in any category. When two sacks of the same weight are submitted, the first sack submitted is considered the winner. There will be an optional tournament jackpot for the heaviest single fish. Tournament awards will be presented at the August club meeting.
- 11. All anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
- 12. All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a <u>Tournament Entry Form</u> and a <u>COPY OF THEIR CURRENT</u> <u>BOAT INSURANCE POLICY</u> prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament. Entrants may sign up anytime prior to the tournament starting date and time. The entry forms must be turned in to the locations or persons listed on the back of this form. All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing or non-members fishing a one-time introductory tournament as a guest of a club member. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director (Adam Larson) with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info (if applicable), and date/time stamp. By signing the application, Applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage, and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
- **13.** Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
- 14. Tournament Angler of the Year and Skipper points will be awarded for this tournament.

5. The San Diego Anglers take no responsibility for personal injury, death, or property damage resulting from any misconduct, negligence, and adverse weather conditions or otherwise, of any persons or its members at sponsored events and tournaments.

6. The San Diego Anglers does not investigate weather or sea conditions, or the possibility of other boating activities, when scheduling its events.

7. By signing this application, the applicant assumes all risks of injury, death, or property damage, and agrees to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury or damage occur.

INSURANCE CERTIFICATION SUBMITTAL

In order to participate in a San Diego Anglers club-sponsored event and/or fishing tournament in which you provide and/or use your own, borrowed, or leased boat, you must submit a copy of the current Boat Insurance Certificate certifying that you have the necessary BOAT & PERSONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE, and that it is in effect during the event and/or tournament.
