



Upcoming Charters - August 2017

We have a few charters that have openings coming up in August. First is a 3/4-day trip on the "**Vendetta**", **Friday**, **August 11**. Cost is \$140 plus \$30 for a Mexican Visa if necessary. A passport or passport card which is valid for the day we will be fishing will be necessary to get on the boat. (We had an unfortunate situation on the last charter where one of the passengers had an expired passport and he was not allowed to go on the trip). This is scheduled to be a Coronado Island trip, but this is the time of the year that the tuna could pop up outside the islands, and if that is the best available fishing, that is what they will do.

Next is a **twilight trip on Friday, Aug 18 on the "New Seaforth"** out of Seaforth landing. Cost is \$10 for adults, and juniors under 16 fish for free. We have had great calico fishing the last few trips and we hope to keep the streak going!

Next is a **3/4-day trip on the "Mission Belle" on Sunday, August 20** out of Point Loma Sportfishing. Cost is \$150 plus \$30 FMM permits if necessary. This will be our first charter on the "Mission Belle" with Captain Peterson and we should do excellent. There is just a few spots available, so let me know asap if you would like to join us. Passport or passport card required on this trip also.

Finally, we have a spot open up on the always full, **2-day trip on the "Success"** on Sunday evening, **August 20, 2017** out of Point Loma Sportfishing. Cost is \$660 plus permits if necessary. Limited load of 12. Normally this trip is full, but we have a last-minute cancellation that I need to fill. We always do great on this trip, last year we caught blufin to 270 ponds on the Yummy Flyer. The trip is always best available fishing, so we do not know what we are going to do this far out. Charter Report - 3/4-Day trips on the "Vendetta" and "Liberty"

We had great trips to the islands on both trips! On the "Vendetta", we grabbed our bait at the receiver and Captain Ray told me that he was going to bring a tank of chovies on this trip, because of what he saw with the bass wanting to play the day before. It ended up being a great decision. We pulled into the Islands and did the normal searching for the yellows, but the current wasn't quite what Ray was looking for, so we headed on down to South Island. He metered around, found what he was looking for and had Nick throw a scoop of anchovies as he was dropping the anchor. The ocean came alive as the calicos and barracuda chased the anchovies to the surface. It was game on the rest of the morning as we enjoyed excellent calico bass fishing. Fish were eating everything, with calicos to 7.5 pounds coming over the rail. For the afternoon, we moved around to the weather side of South Island and dropped the anchor, again as a scoop of anchovies went over the side with the same results: Bass and Barracuda jumping out of the water. Every once in awhile a yellowtail would come and play behind the boat, but they remained elusive for whatever reason. At the end of the day when we were getting ready to leave, the yellows decided to eat and we ended up with 6 or 8 yellows to about 17 lbs for our efforts. We caught and released so much fish that day that everyone's arms were sore and were actually sitting down and not fishing anymore. I think there was only 3 people fishing when the yellows hit at the end of the day as everyone else was rubbing Ben-Gay on their sore arms! We all walked off the boat with big smiles and even bigger bags of fish!


The following Thursday, 30 of us boarded the "Liberty", for our first-ever charter on the new 3/4-day boat out of Fisherman's Landing. It is a very large boat with plenty of deck space, huge galley and seating and bunks for when you need to lay down. Crew was excellent, along with Captain Taro! We loaded up our bait with the same game plan as the week before: Yellows the primary target and everything else secondary. We got to the Islands to find a massive bird pile up outside North Island. We scooted over there to find no fish but a sea of anchovy scales everywhere in the water. Whatever attacked the anchovy ball was long gone, leaving only the scales! We ducked into the island on the weather side and the conditions looked pretty good as we chucked bait and caught a few fish on the irons and firecracker sardines that we had on board. We hung around waiting for the current to start flowing a little more to the east for the fishing to really turn on, but it did not, so Taro headed down to the ever-so-popular weather side of South Island. The rest of the fleet was there also and we slid in to join the party. We started catching yellows and bass but not fast enough for Taro, so we pulled the hook and started searching to the south, along with the boat "San Diego". We picked away at schools of yellows for a few hours, then moved back to South Island to drop the hook again. This time it would not disappoint. The yellows charged the boat and did not stop until we pulled the hook and went home. We ended up catching over 100 yellows that day, along with the many bass that was available if you chose to fish for them! We had an excellent day on the water as everyone either retired to the galley to get a giant hamburger from Sarah or to those great bunks down below for the short ride home from the Islands, as the "Liberty" is a very fast boat. So fast, the crew did not have time to clean all of the fish on the way home and we had to stop outside the mouth of the harbor for 30 minutes as we finished up the job. And as the previous Thursday, we all walked off the boat with big smiles and even bigger bags of fish!! I am guessing these charters will fill up again right away next year!! 
3B tournament on July 22nd.

Even though the Barracuda were the most clusive, several just short of the 28" size limit were caught. Overall, the fishing was good, and Frank Santiago also pulled in a halibut just over 20 lbs on a Hook-up Bait!

After the event, everyone enjoyed some pulled pork sandwiches and refreshments at the South Shores Launch Ramp in Mission Bay. Dwayne, Louis, and Dave stopped by after the Crystal Pier Kids Derby to help out with the weigh-in. 

August 03 thru September 04, 2017

Tournament channel 72

- 1. The official starting time of the tournament is 12:01am on Wednesday, August 03, 2017. The official ending time of the tournament is 08:00pm on Monday, September 04, 2017.
- 2. Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time. All club tournaments are operated on an honor system.
- 3. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be limited to those waters of the Pacific Ocean within 125 miles of San Diego.
- 4. During the tournament, fishing can be done from any fishing platform, including Sportfishing boats
- **5.** Bait may be caught, purchased, or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used, or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
- **6.** IGFA angling rules will be used for this tournament. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance with all California or Mexican fishing and boating laws and regulations, as applicable.
- 7. Weight Receipts: It is the responsibility of each entrant to submit all weight receipts signed, witnessed, with time/date stamp to the Club Weighmaster (Mike Sur) no later than 11:59pm September 04, 2017. Weight receipts received after this deadline will be disqualified. Weight receipts can be found on the Club website. Weight receipts can be scanned and emailed to Club Weighmaster. More than one weight receipt per angler may be submitted.
- **8.** Species: All species, excluding sharks and rays. All-around Angler Club Points System will apply for winning places to level the playing field. Tournament awards will be presented at the September club meeting.
- **9.** Cash prizes based on participation will be awarded in the following categories: <u>Highest Single Fish Point Total</u> 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th with a 5th place free entry for adults; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for juniors. There will be no ties in any categories. When two fish of the same weight are submitted, the first fish submitted by date and time is considered the winner.
- 10. All anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
- 11. All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a <u>Tournament Entry Form</u> and a <u>COPY OF THEIR CURRENT BOAT INSURANCE POLICY</u> prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament. Entrants may sign up any time prior to the tournament starting date and time. The entry forms must be turned in to the locations or persons listed on the back of this form. All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing or non-members fishing a one-time introductory tournament as a guest of a club member. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director (Adam Larson) with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info (if applicable), and date/time stamp. By signing the application, applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage, and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
- 12. Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
- 13. Tournament angler of the year points will be awarded for this tournament. There will be NO Skipper points awarded for this tournament.

There will be no food after tournament.
