Charters Update

We are down to our last few charters of the Year, but before I get to those, I will give you the reports from our August charters.

First one out of the gate was the 3/4 day to the Islands on the "Mission Belle". The water had cooled and shut down the yellow fishing pretty good and when Captain Steve got on the boat, he told me he was glad that we liked to fish reds, as that was what we were probably going to be doing considering the water conditions. Steve did the obligatory tour of the islands, checking conditions as we went. We made a few stops for little and decided to move outside for reds. We started catching our rockfish and after picking away at the bottom fish, we decided to go check the conditions again at North Island. We were surprised when the conditions had changed favorably for the afternoon and the yellows actually started to cooperate. We had a few good flashes of yellows the rest of the afternoon before we left, and I think everyone had a chance or two at them. We still had a great time that day and we will definitely be back on the boat as it is a well-run operation on a very fishy boat.

Next charter up was the "Vendetta". The Yellowfin tuna had moved in thick just outside the Islands and we were ready to go get them. The evening before the big day, I got a call from Captain Ray that changed everything. He told me he was at the fuel dock getting fuel for our charter and the engine would not start. AARRGGGH! The starter went bad and there was not one available in San Diego, so he had to cancel. Needless to say, the fishing was wide open the next day as the fleet killed them. We will see about rebooking but he did not have many dates available left on his schedule.

The next trip was the rescheduled twilight charter due to bad weather in May. The last one we had on the "New Seaforth" to La Jolla was pretty spectacular, and we were hoping for a repeat. We loaded the boat and got up to La Jolla ASAP as the days are definitely getting shorter now. We dropped anchor and started to catch a few bass and mackerel and had fun for about 90 minutes before the conditions started to peter out and the fish stopped biting. The Hook Up Bait kids on the boat probably did the best catching and releasing quite a few bass. We moved as the sun went down but really did not catch too much. Thankfully, the weather was flat calm and the sunset spectacular as we still had a great evening fishing. As a smart man once said, "Don't ever let slow catching get in the way of a good fishing trip"!

September Charters

We are down to our last three scheduled charter and the timing is perfect. The tuna have moved in in force and it has been almost limit -style fishing. We have a 2-day trip on the "Liberty" Sept 10-11, a 3/4 -day on the "San Diego" on Sept 15, and a 3/4-day on the "Liberty" on Sept 30. - The entire event is held in the South Parking lot. That is where you will register (of course the event is free for kids) when you arrive and get your free gifts before you start fishing. Then you can fish wherever you'd like.



- Since we have so many wonderful attendees and never enough parking, if you are parked at Chambers Park, you can leave your vehicle there and we will be sending our pontoon boats over to transport you to the main derby side (and of course back). Just ask the ranger at Chambers Park that day how it will work!

If you have tried to purchase an annual Mexican fishing license recently, you know that there has been an issue as you could not find one. At the time of this writing, the Mexican government had closed its San Diego office that was used by all the landings and tackle shops to purchase annual Mexican fishing licenses, with no explanation. Needless to say, there are no annual Mex fishing licenses to purchase, which has caused a mild panic. (The landings have plenty



of one-day licenses they use on the boats). SAC (Sportfishing Association of California) is looking to get it corrected ASAP, but in the meantime, there is a solution if you are looking to purchase an annual license.

Go online to http://pesca.ebajacalifornia.gob.mx/Pesca/ to purchase an annual license. Cost is about \$39 .Just a few tips to make it easier....*** Click on the American flag to translate the page. ***You must register, which is easy. ***When it asks for the area, just choose the top one.*** When it comes time to pay with your credit card, Choose "MXN" and not "US Dollars", otherwise, the charge will be declined. One more tip: print more than one license, in case you lose or misplace one.

Captain Phil's Killer Jerk Tuna Rum Pineapple and Tomato Kabobs

Ingredients for the marinade:

- 1 red onion chopped in quarters
- 1- habanero chili seeded
- 1- fresno red chili whole
- 2- green onions chopped
- 1- clove garlic chopped
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 3/4 tsp ground allspice
- 1/4 tsp nutmeg
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 1/4 tsp dried thyme
- 3 tsp sea salt
- 3 tablespoons of vegetable or canola oil
- zest and juice of one lime



Ingredients for the fish:

- Bamboo kabob skewers (soaked in water for one hour)
- One pound of yellowfin or bluefin tuna (also great with yellowtail) cubed into 1 to 1/2 inch cubes
- Pineapple (fresh or canned) cubed into 1 to 1/2 inch
- Cherry tomatoes (about 12 or so)
- 1/4 cup dark rum (Captain Morgan or Bacardi)
- 1 tablespoon of brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp of vanilla extract

Recipe for the marinade:

Combine all the marinade ingredients into a food processer or a blender and purée Cut up the fish and cover with marinade and put in the fridge (marinade for a half hour or until your grill is ready if using charcoal)

Recipe for the pineapple:

Cube up the pineapple and mix up the rum, vanilla, and brown sugar and add to the pineapple and set aside on counter (do this when you marinade the fish)

Cook time!

Skewer up the kabobs with the pineapple, fish and the cherry tomatoes and grill on a med to hot grill sprayed with Pam for about 2 minutes per side or until your liking

Note: this is really mild so don't let habanero scare you and if you like it with a little more zip add one more habanero and 1 more tablespoon of oil to the (blender or processer)

Garnish with sliced lemon and lime (also great with a side of rice and black beans). Enjoy and happy grilling!

Captain Pelican Phil's Poke Patties

Ingredients

Patties:

- 1 1/2 cups fresh Ahi or yellowtail diced to 3/8 to 1/2 inch cubes
- 3 Stalks green onion chopped fine
- 1 Shallot minced fine
- 1 Fresno red chili seeded and chopped fine
- 1 Teaspoon of sesame oil
- 2 Tablespoons of soy sauce
- 1 Egg beaten
- 1 or more cups of panko bread crumbs (Asian section)
- 2 Tablespoons of canola or vegetable oil for frying

Sauce:

- 1 Tablespoon of butter
- 1/4 cup of fresh shitake mushrooms stemmed and sliced super thin
- 1 Teaspoon of oyster sauce (Asian section)
- 1 Teaspoon of soy sauce
- 1/2 cup of coconut milk
- 1/2 Teaspoon of black bean garlic sauce (Asian section)
- 2 Teaspoons of chopped cilantro or Italian parsley if you don't care for cilantro

Preparation for Patties:

Combine all the pattie ingredients in a bowl except the oil, add the oil to the pan and heat, mix the pattie ingredients, including the beaten egg (as a binder) together and add a little more panko if needed to help form patties and don't be shy press your hands together tight and make patties about 3 inches across to make a total of 4 patties and fry for about two minutes on each side to keep the center medium rare or until desired doneness.

Sauce: In separate pan heat up butter and add mushrooms and sauté for 2 minutes. Next add the rest of the sauce ingredients and cook for about another minute, heat up to get a little simmer but be careful not to burn the coconut milk. Place a little sauce on plate and plate the fish patties and add a little sauce on top. This makes a great appetizer or a meal with a side of white rice and I like a little Sambal oelek chili sauce (Asian section) on the side.
