



San Diego Anglers Charter


We are coming into the final few charters for the year: three on the “Liberty” and one on the “Vagabond.” September 15-17 is a 2-day trip on the “Liberty”, and the cost of the trip is \$560 plus food and permits (if necessary). We will leave the night of the 15th and return the night of the 17th. Load is limited to 24. We still have a few spots open on this trip.

Next trip is a 3/4-day tip on the “Liberty”, Monday, September 28. Limited load of 30 and the cost will be \$170.

Because the tuna have been so good the last few Octobers, we have scheduled our first October charter on the “Liberty”, Wednesday, October 14. Limited load of 30, and the cost will be \$170. No passport will be necessary on this trip.

I have not put any of the 3/4-day “Liberty” trips up yet on the charter board, but they will be up soon.

The “Vagabond” 10-day trip has a couple of rare openings this year. If you would like to join us this year on an ultra limited load trip of 16, please let me know. This is always an exciting adventure south into Mexican waters looking for tuna, wahoo, yellowtail and anything else that decides that it wants to swim within casting distance of the boat.

Article from Coastal Conservation Association (CCA)

Even while in the midst of a global pandemic, advocacy in the state of California does not stop, as we've been quite busy in 2020. At the Federal level, The Great American Outdoors Act has recently passed and is now awaiting a signature from President Trump. This act fully funds the Land and Water Conservation Fund – a go-to program for conserving and maximizing outdoor recreation access. This bill also tackles the maintenance backlog on our public lands and waters by investing in boating and infrastructure like docks, ramps and parking facilities.



Our biggest priority for the past few months has been California Assembly Bill 3030, which could have potentially huge ramifications on our fishing in California. We have dubbed it as “MLPA 2.0”, and is aiming to “protect” 30% of all land, water and ocean by 2030, but the bill is so ambiguous that almost nobody knows how it will be done, how its success (or failure) can be measured, or how much it is going to cost. We have helped build one of the largest coalitions in opposition to AB3030, ran many different campaigns, and are actively meeting with groups and people in Sacramento, making sure our voices are heard. AB3030 is set to be heard by the Natural Resources and Water committee in the California State Senate in mid-August, and we will surely keep you posted as to what happens. We still need everyone’s help in writing their senators, filling out our online petition, joining CCA, and donating to CCA California. You can find all of that information on our home page at www.ccacalifornia.org.

AB1387, which is the bill that is aiming to bring a 365-day license to California, was recently killed by the Senate. With 2020 being a rather unique year because of COVID-19, most bills that were not related to COVID-19, homelessness and fire resourcing ended up being shelved for 2020. There is some good news however, as the bill author, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), and the fishing community have all agreed to re-introduce the bill in 2021. This will be in correlation with the R3 program, which is set out to recruit, retain, reactivate new anglers and hunters in the state of California.

AB1949 also recently made its way through the Natural Resources and Water committee in the Senate via the consent file, and is continuing to move closer towards a signature from Governor Gavin Newsom. If passed, AB1949 will update the statutory language of the Ocean Resources Enhancement and Hatchery Program (OREHP).

Even with all of the curveballs that we've been thrown this year, I am proud to say that all of our local chapters are managing pretty well right now. Because of all current restrictions, we've had to cancel or postpone many of our chapter banquets, including the local San Diego Chapter banquet at Portuguese Hall. The chapter has decided to get creative and turn their fundraiser into a week-long virtual banquet that will be happening from August 31st to September 5th. We will be having an online auction, a virtual target raffle, membership drive and having some fun. Look out for some more details on that coming out very soon! Also, our San Diego chapter put on “A Day on the Bay with CCA”, which was remarkably successful and brought out almost 50 anglers, many of them from San Diego Anglers, all fishing together from a distance. We are hoping to roll that out to our remaining chapters later on this year.

We also have the SoCal Charter Challenge coming up on October 11-13th. This year, our San Diego chapter will be on the “Pacifica” out of Seaforth Landing this year. Because of the current restrictions, we have a limited load of 26 going out this year. If you are interested in going, please sign up at www.ccacalifornia.org.

The future is certainly bright for CCA California as we continue to establish credibility in the sportfishing industry, especially as AB3030 has hit the Senate. Now is the perfect time to get involved! Our San Diego chapter meets every 2nd Tuesday of the month at 7pm. We are continuing to meet via conference calls and are currently looking for new board members! If you are interested in being involved with our chapter board, please make sure to contact David Chavez, President of the CCA San Diego Chapter, or [contact us on our website](#).

We have already laid the groundwork in starting 2 brand new local chapters in Bakersfield and Morro Bay. Once COVID-19 subsides, we have individuals on the ground in those local communities that are ready to start both of those chapters and continue growing the CCA California brand up north.


