

June 2021 "Vendetta" 3/4-day Charter

We gathered at the dock anticipating a fun-filled day fishing with friends. Weather was looking good as we left the dock and headed for the bait barge. With full bait tanks, Captain Ray pointed the bow towards the Coronado Islands and we were under way. Most took advantage of the calm seas and napped as we made our way to the south kelp.

We stopped to make our first drift, and the bite was on. Dropper loop sardines, fly line, Hook-Up Baits, the bass were hitting everything we threw at 'em. Bent rods up and down the rail port and starboard.

Didn't take long for the barracuda to join in, and at first we could get below them and rip lip on the big calicos. When the bite showed the slightest signs of slowing, Captain Ray would reposition the boat and full on fish flying over the rail continued on.

A well-deserved and very tasty lunch was served as we moved to a new spot. Ed Holler dropped a flatfall and hooked a nice yellowtail. Big calicos, up to about 8lbs., continued biting. We repositioned again and the lingcod were hitting hard. There were a dozen or more caught, with eight or so as keepers. Tammy caught her first ever White Sea Bass, measuring just shy of keeper. Shelly hooked a yel-

lowtail on a Hook-Up Bait, and Tim hooked his on a sardine.

By now the barracuda had surrounded us, and with limits of calico, three yellowtail, several lingcod and an assortment of rockfish, we headed for the dock. All in all, a wonderful day on the water.



"Vagabond" 3-Day Charter

Coming out of the Covid lockdown, the first face-to-face event that the San Diego Anglers had was the award banquet. Tara and I thought it would be a great opportunity to have some good food and good times catching up with everyone in attendance. We were right: the food was great and it was awesome to see everyone and talk about fishing again. We always participate in the raffles but don't really expect to win anything, it's just part of going to meetings. As the banquet was winding down and it started getting late, we began making our way to the exit so we could pick up our daughter from her grandmother. It was the last prize of the night, a 3-day trip on the "Vagabond". We were at the exit as the numbers were being read. Tara checked her tickets and looked at me and said, "Babe, I think we won." I looked at her in disbelief as she checked the ticket a second time. This time she said confidently we won. She yells, "hook up", and begins walking to the podium. Once it was verified that we did win, Dwayne asked Tara who's going on the trip and she said I was going. I wanted to make sure we both got to share the experience, so I got in contact with Mike Lackey and he was able to get a space for both of us on the boat.

Fast forward to the date of departure. This was our first multi-day trip and our first trip targeting big bluefins. Neither of us had ever caught a fish over 40 pounds or a bluefin. We arrived at the landing two hours early. We were the fourth group in line. We got lucky because in front of us were two guys, Tim and Miles. They had been fishing long-range trips together for over 20 years and had several successful trips on the "Vagabond". They were very open, welcoming, and shared several tips and tricks with us throughout the trip. These guys were the hot sticks on this trip. The crew for the trip consisted of Mike, Jake, Tommy, Joe Boo, Chowder, Dave and Adam. The first day of fishing was like every bluefin trip you hear about. We see a big school of fish, we toss everything we have at them, and maybe one or two get hooked if we are lucky. Usually it was Tim or Miles getting those AM bites. The fishing didn't really go off until nighttime. Around 11 pm we started seeing more signs of schools that wanted to cooperate. Then finally at 2 am the first night I got my first bite. The fish was big and mean. It took long runs that seemed like they would never end. Several times I was sure I was going to get spooled. The fish did everything it could to get away, including numerous tangles, taking me around the boat several times, going under the boat, and getting unbuttoned and then rehooked in the side. When the fish went under the boat, I am not sure what happened but Mike was on deck to save the day. He grabbed a rod with a jig on it and went to the other side of the boat and was able to snag my line, keeping it from going into the prop. Cut the line and retie it before the fish realized it had a chance to escape. I am not sure how long the fight lasted. It seemed like three hours but was probably closer to two hours. In the end, thanks to Mike and the amazing crew of the "Vagabond," I can tell you the first bluefin I ever caught was a 177 lb. fish of a lifetime. I saw several fish landed and lost that first night. A Shark grabbed ahold of one of the fish but only chewed on the head then let it go. The bite lasted until 4 am.

The second day was the slowest of the trip, with few fish landed in the day, and then at night the bite turned on again between 11 pm to 3-4 am. Tara did catch her 1st Bluefin in the daytime, so it was still exciting and a good day.

The last day of the trip had the first fish caught on the kite using a flying fish as bait. This fish was over 200 lbs. and caught by an angler from a group from Minnesota that usually does a fishing trip up to Canada but because the border is still closed due to Covid, they decided to come to San Diego instead. The fishing got really good around 11 pm on Day 3. We got on a drift that lasted from 11 pm to 4 am. Everyone caught at least one fish, with most anglers getting the opportunity to pull on a plussize model. The bite was so good we ended up fishing two hours past the time we were scheduled to leave, and when we finally pulled away the fish were still biting.

"Vagabond" 3-day Charter

The crew was amazing, the food was amazing. It is really hard to come back home and cook for yourself after having the great meals and snacks you receive aboard the "Vagabond". The things that I learned on this trip would take another two articles to completely lay out. The quick version is

- 1. Listen to the crew
- 2. Stay at the rail
- 3. Stay positive
- 4. Understand how the boat drifts and make sure you get your jig out away from the boat so once it is in the zone it is vertical
- 5. You need to give motion to your flat fall by feeding the line so it flutters on the way down.
- 6. Per Mike, once you think your in the zone let it drop, stop, pause, wind up, drop, stop repeat
- 7. Use a black light flashlight to get your jig to glow.

What got bit

1. 300-gram flat fall, 200-lb. leader, Penn Fathom 40 narrow two-speed paired with Calstar GF770 XXH - I do not own a big fish setup, and the boat provided the setup at no additional cost. Besides the flat fall, the other jig I know that got bit was the 400-gram knife jig and 200-gram Colt Snipers. Sinker rigs also got bit during the daytime.




PROCEDURE TO APPLY FOR AWARDS:

July's 3 – B's Tournament

The month of July is time for our 3 - B's Tournament: Bass, Barracuda, and Bonita.

- This year the tournament will start at 6:00 AM on Thursday, July 1, 2021, and runs until 5:00 PM on July 18, 2021.
- All measurement receipts must be turned in before 6:00 PM on the 18th.
- All receipt turn-in times will be determined by the date time stamp on the email/text used to send in the receipts.
- This tournament will be under the measurement rules. Remember that only fish of legal size, even if they are released, will be scored.
- Anglers can submit multiple measurement receipts of the same species but only the largest fish of each specie will be counted toward your 3-fish sack.
- 3-fish sack = 1 bass, 1 barracuda, 1 Bonita
- This will be a 3-fish sack tournament; where 3 fish beat 2, and 2 fish beat 1 fish.
- Entries will be accepted up until 6:00 AM on Friday, July 16, 2021.
- All Anglers must have their entry submitted (email/text date time stamp) before 6:00 AM of their first day of fishing.

So just because you have other commitments for the 4th of July weekend does not keep you out of the tournament.

We are looking forward to having a great turnout for this tournament! See you on the water,

Well, another tournament is in the record book. While there were no records set at this tournament, we had great weather, great sea conditions, and some great anglers out there. We even had a ¾-day trip that went out for Yellowtail. Sometimes you can have all the stars and moon lined up and things can still go wrong. Of all the anglers on the ¾-day trip, the only guys that did not catch Yellowtail were the guys signed up for the tournament. With 23 days of tournament fishing, only one angler was successful. Congratulations, Adam Larson, our tournament winner, with a 36.5" yellowtail.

This month is our annual July 3-B's tournament. Starting on Thursday, July 1, 2021, at 06:00 AM, and running till Sunday, July 18, at 5:00 PM, with your measurement required to be turned in electronically by 5:00 PM. We will be accepting entries up until 06:00 AM, Friday, July 16, 2021. All entries must be turned in before 06:00 AM of the angler's first day of fishing.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone out for the tournament and having a great time. Next Month (August) we will have our "All Species Tournament". It will also be the start of the First Annual "Earl Asbury Tournament" Look for more information coming out on our website and via emails.

Upcoming Tournaments!

August and September are always especially good time for fishing is San Diego. So, it should be no surprise that we are having two tournaments during this time.

The first one is the August All Species Tournament. Starting on 6:00 AM, Sunday, August 1st, running till 5:00 PM, Sunday, August 18th. All Species is just that: any species of fish that is on the club's Angler of the Year list is fair game. (Only if it is of legal size). For this tournament you will need to send in weight recipes to our Weighmaster Andrew Hauser so the weight can be converted to a point score for each fish. Multiple weight receipts can be sent in, but only your biggest scoring fish (only 1 fish) will be counted for this tournament. So, it doesn't matter if it is a bass, halibut, yellowtail, marlin or a tuna, they are all converted to a score. The same way that it is done for the Angler of the Year is done. We will take each angler's single highest scoring fish and count that as your entry for the tournament. The top 5 highest scoring fish will be our adult winners, and the top 3 highest scoring fish for our junior winners

Now for our other tournament we are having during this time is the

First Annual - Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament!

For Tuna (blue or yellow fin), Mahi-mahi, and Yellowtail

This will be a Club-Member-Only Tournament.

This tournament will also be starting at 6:00 AM on Sunday, August 1st, 2021. However, it will run until 5:00 PM, Saturday, September 25, 2021, with all measurement receipts turned in before 6:00 PM on Saturday, September 25th, 2021. Turn-in times will be determined by the date/time stamp on the email/text.

This will be like three tournaments in one. Each species of fish will have its own winners, with the First-Place winner in each specie getting added "EARL" winnings.

In this tournament will be a measurement rules with some minor differences. Normally we have a rigid measuring device under the fish and we pinch the tail for the overall length. This is tournament you will use a soft tape and smoothly extend the tape from the nose (closed mouth) to the "Y" of the tail. This will help account for the differences between long, skinny and shorter, fatter fish. Besides, I have never been able to pinch the tail of a tuna together. With several of our anglers out on party boats, some of the IGFA rules will be modified for this tournament. These will be included in the entry form.

If that's not enough, anglers entered in both tournaments can use their tuna, mahi-mahi, or yellowtail for both tournaments if the catch date is during the overlap of the two tournaments, August 1 thru 18. Remember the receipts must be submitted separately for each tournament, due to the different scoring systems. Once is measurement, and one is by weight.

Why will we be ending the tournament on Saturday, September 25, 2021? Because on Sunday, September 26, we will be having our Summer picknick and awards for the Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament. This is one event you will not want to miss! More to come on the picnic, and the entry forms for both tournaments should be sent out on or before July 26, 2021.

San Diego Anglers 3-B's Tournament RULES AND ENTRY FORM



July 1, 2021

- 1. The official starting time of the tournament is 06:00 am on Thursday July 1, 2021. The official ending time of the tournament is 5:00 pm on Sunday, July 18, 2021. THIS WILL BE A MEASUREMENT RULE TOURNAMENT.
- 2. Entries will be accepted until 06:00 am Friday July 16, 2021. The entry must be turned in before your first day of fishing.
- Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time. All club tournaments are operated on an honor system.
- 4. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be limited to those waters of the Pacific Ocean within 125 miles of San Diego.
- 5. During the tournament, fishing can be done from any fishing platform, including Sport Fishing Boats.
- 6. Bait may be caught, purchased, or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used, or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
- IGFA angling rules will be used for this tournament. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance with all California or Mexican fishing and boating laws and regulations, as applicable.
- 8. All fish entry photographs must be e-mail to lindseysj@aol.com with an email date/time of no later than 6:00 PM, Sunday, July18, 2021. Late entries will not be accepted. There must be 2 photo's per fish:
 - First Photo: Shall show the whole fish and the anglers name printed legibly on an Index Card, with the measuring device behind the fish, to see the overall length of the fish.
 - Second Photo: Shall be of the same fish, this time of the tail section of the fish against the measuring device so as to be able to read the length of the fish to the nearest 1/8".
 - Photos that are not in focus enough to be properly read will not be accepted. You will be notified as soon as the photos are reviewed, if they are not acceptable.
- 9. **Eligible Species**: Bonita, Barracuda, and Bass. Entrants can submit multiple measurement receipts, only the largest single fish of each species will be counted for that angler.
- 10. Prizes will be awarded in the following categories: **Longest 3 fish Sack Measured** 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place for adults; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for juniors. There will be no ties in any category. When two entries of the same length are submitted, the first sack submitted (based on the date time stamp on the email) considered the winner. Tournament awards will be presented at the Next Monthly Club meeting.
- 11. Jackpot: There will be a \$10.00 optional Jackpot, for the longest single fish; of any of the eligible species (3-B's).
- 12. All Anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
- 13. All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a <u>Tournament Entry Form</u> and a <u>COPY OF THEIR CURRENT BOAT INSUR-ANCE POLICY</u> prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament. Entrants may sign up any time prior to the tournament starting date and time. The entry forms must be turned in to the persons listed on page two of this form. All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing or non-members fishing as a guest of a club member. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info (if applicable), and date/time stamp. By signing the application, applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage, and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
- 14. Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
- 15. Tournament Angler of the Year and Skipper points will be awarded for this tournament.

San Diego Anglers Measurement Tournament Information

- 1) The 2021 July, SD ANGLERS 3-B Tournament will be a multi-day event under the SDA Measurement Rule.
- 2) All Anglers MUST BE signed up PROIR TO FISHING. Entry forms must be sent in before 6:00 AM of the first day the angler will be fishing. Entries will be accepted up until Friday, July16, 2021.
- 3) All fish MUST BE of legal size to be scored, <u>even if the fish is released</u>. The fish must be photographed against the measuring device as depicted in diagram below.
- 4) All fish must be measured the same way: Nose of the fish at the "0" end of the scale, fish lying flat on the scale. Closed mouth, pinched tail flat on the scale with a clear view of measuring device.
- 5) The photos of the catch MUST BE IN FOCUS. <u>First Photo</u> shall show the whole fish, with a clear view of where the tail comes to on the measuring device, and the angler's name. The angler's name may be written on an index card or the back of your hand. Either way it must be legible. <u>Second Photo</u> shall be of the tail section so as to be able to easily read the measuring device to the nearest 1/8".
- 6) The Photos and Measurement Rule Tournament Fish Report form (Fill out completely for <u>each species</u> being entered. Example: Three species, three forms and 6 photos) must be e-mailed to <u>lindseysj@aol.com</u> before the closing deadline, 6:00 PM, July 18, 2021.
- 7) All lengths will be determined/confirmed by the tournament director based on photo sent in.

HOW TO MEASURE TOTAL LENGTH OF CATCH

The **total length** is the maximum length of the fish, with the mouth closed and the tail fin pinched together. The best way to obtain this length is to push the fish's snout up against a vertical surface with the mouth closed and the fish laying along a tape measure, then pinch the tail fin closed and determine the total length. Do NOT pull a flexible tape measure along the curve of the fish. Prior to getting a final measurement the caudal (tail) fin will be pinched shut.
