



San Diego Anglers 2-Day Liberty Trip

As most around San Diego County used their Tuesday night in the first week of October finding their Halloween boxes, 20 eager fishermen from all ages and fishing backgrounds kin to the San Diego Anglers organization took voyage for a two-day hunt for pelagic species on the spacious sport fishing vessel the *Liberty*, stationed out of Fisherman's Landing. Captain Taro Takeuchi's game plan for the trip was to start the first day northwest nearly 80+ miles around the Tanner/Cortez Bank, in search of the elusive Bluefin tuna; and throughout the night travel back south to Mexican waters "paddy hopping" for warmer watered pelagic species such as Yellowfin Tuna and Dorado. Taro and crew gear suggestions for the first day comprised of a 30#/40# fly-line setup with at least a three-foot leader of matching fluorocarbon with a #1 or 1/0 "J" or circle hook and to have a 50#/60# Flatfall or rubber sinker ready for deeper meter marks. At night, the large knife jigs, that could be purchased at the landing before departure, with at least an 80#/100# outfit with a 300lb. Short-crimped leader was the key to landing a fish of a lifetime. For the second day, a fly line 25#/30# setup with matching fluorocarbon and a smaller #2 or #1 hook was the key to success.

Our first day on the Pacific blue, although full of tremendous food from the galley and high spirits amongst anglers, ended up being a lot more of an ocean excursion than fishing for most of the day. Starting with the rest of the fleet for breezing Bluefin on anchor, our group was able to scratch out one 20lbs Bluefin on the fly-line. Taro and crew searched vigorously around the area in search for biting fish, but due to post low-pressure-conditions and boating pressure from the fleet and private boaters, the Bluefin didn't want to play. In a last-ditch effort before dinner and transitioning to the cows at night, we anchored up at Cortez Bank with a successful slow picking of 15-20lbs yellowtail mixed with the occasional 5-10lbs Bonita that kept us at the rail the rest of the evening into the Pacific sunset. The key was bait selection, and changing out your bait consistently. After a delicious tri tip dinner with Sarah in the galley, we took our shot at the trophies with knife jigs dropping down between 180-500ft, to no avail, and put day one in the books as we proceeded south in search of warmer water.

Day two proved to be a lot more promising from daybreak. A lot more life was present from grey light, with large schools of porpoise and working birds within the first few hours of putting out the trollers. It was not long before the boys in the tower located a small kelp paddy with a dense school of Dorado on it, orchestrating the symphonic sound of drags singing and changing the state of fishing, to catching. Full-speed organized chaos was the synopsis for day two. Every paddy we found, although few and far between, was *loaded* with schooling Dorado ranging from 10lbs to the boat's jackpot of 22lbs! Again, the ticket to play consisted of selecting a non-marked, green back, "hot" sardine and being in the water once Taro gave the okay to drop in. We ended the trip with 1 Bluefin, 16 yellowtail, a handful of bonito, rock-fish, and limits of Dorado for our San Diego Anglers family.

The "Liberty" and crew are one of the best in California hands down. More eager than us to find fish, calm and collective during chaos times, 5-star quality meals and snacks, and exceptional customer service from start to finish. Charter Captain Dwayne Patenaude may be the best charter head out there, making sure everyone on the trip was accommodated with proper sleeping arrangements, and thorough communication on all we needed to know in regards to the trip to allow for us to focus on fishing. Good weather, great fishing, even better comraderie with the SD Anglers family. Hope to see you there next year.

This was quite a special day. We planned to have to go fishing in the Santa Monica Bay for Bass and Calico. We said we'd get off the water by 11 and our goal was to catch 50 fish before we left. The fishing was slow at the Santa Monica brick wall and AR. We moved down to The Pipe and got on a good Sand Bass bite. The fish were all spitting up squid, so I switched to purple and brown on my double rig. 49 bass in and I said, "OK, let's wind them up, move in, and get one last Calico." At that point a Yellowtail just completely smashed my Hookup Baits double rig. I jumped in the driver seat and chased down the fish to get above it. Then, proceeded to fight it back to the boat. Cash gaffed it with his rickety old kayak gaff. I reached down and grabbed the tail, and we both heaved it into the boat. When it landed on the deck, we knew we had a record catch for our boat. It was the first Yellowtail ever boated on the SS Baybasher. What a fine specimen it was. Those are the kinds of father-son memories that we will never forget.

The San Diego Anglers only accepts this online weight receipt or the official paper version of the San Diego Anglers Official Weight Receipt. No other weight receipts from other clubs are acceptable. November 2021 BASS SLAM TOURNAMENT RULES AND ENTRY FORM

Saturday, November 6th, 2021



The official starting time of the tournament is 6:00 AM on Saturday, November 6th, 2021. The official ending time of the tournament is 4:00 PM on Saturday, November 6th, 2021. THIS WILL BE A LIVE WEIGH IN TOURNAMENT.

NOTE: All State and County COVID-19 Directives must be adhered to.

1. Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time. All club tournaments are operated on an honor system
2. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be limited to those waters of the Pacific Ocean within 125 miles of San Diego.
3. During the tournament, fishing can be done from any fishing platform, including Sportfishing boats.
4. Bait may be caught, purchased, or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used, or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
5. IGFA angling rules will be used for this tournament. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance with all California or Mexican fishing and boating laws and regulations, as applicable.
6. **All fish must be weighed in on the Club Scale between 3:00 PM and 4:00 PM at the San Diego Anglers Tournament Weigh Station at the SHELTER ISLAND BOAT LAUNCH RAMP on San Diego Bay.**
7. Eligible Species: Calico Bass, Sand Bass, and Spotted Bay Bass. Entrants can **weigh in only one fish from each species, the day of tournament. Only your heaviest fish of each species will count toward your 3 fish sack, with only one sack per registered angler.**
8. Prizes will be awarded in the following categories: **Heaviest Sack Weight** - 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place for adults; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for all junior classes. Regardless of weight, 3-bass sack beats a 2-bass Sack and a 2-bass Sack beats a 1-bass Sack. There will be no ties in any category. When two sacks of the same weight are submitted, the first sack submitted is considered the winner. Tournament awards will be presented at the NEXT club meeting.
9. Jackpot: There will be a \$10.00 optional Jackpot for the LARGEST single fish from any of the *eligible* Bass species.
10. All anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
11. All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a Tournament Entry Form and a COPY OF THEIR CURRENT BOAT INSURANCE POLICY prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament. Entrants may sign up any time prior to the tournament starting date and time. The entry forms must be turned in to the locations or persons listed on the back of this form. All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info (if applicable), and date/time stamp. By signing the application, applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage, and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
12. Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
13. Tournament Angler of the Year and Skipper points will be awarded for this tournament.

5. The San Diego Anglers take no responsibility for personal injury, death, or property damage resulting from any misconduct, negligence, and adverse weather conditions or otherwise, of any persons or its members at sponsored events and tournaments.
6. The San Diego Anglers does not investigate weather or sea conditions, or the possibility of other boating activities, when scheduling its events.
7. By signing this application, the applicant assumes all risks of injury, death, or property damage, and agrees to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury or damage occur.

INSURANCE CERTIFICATION SUBMITTAL

In order to participate in a San Diego Anglers club-sponsored event and/or fishing tournament in which you provide and/or use your own, borrowed, or leased boat, **you must submit a copy of the current Boat Insurance Certificate** certifying that you have the necessary BOAT & PERSONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE, and that it is in effect during the event and/or tournament.
