## San Diego Anglers 2021 Tournament Angler and Skipper of the Year!

I think most of us out there would consider it perfect. Overall, this year has been a lot of fun for all of us.

Well, let's get to the Tournament Anglers of the Year. Junior Tournament Angler of the Year for 2021, with just 2 points between first and second place coming down to the last tournament, the Junior Tournament Angler of the Year is CASH TROOP! Congratulations, Cash!

It was great watching you and Justin Larson battle it out through the year. We look forward to seeing what happens next year. Good luck to both of you and all our junior anglers.

The Adult Tournament Angler of the Year and the Skipper of the Year is one and the same. With 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> places for Tournament Angler of the Year separated by only 5 points and coming down to the last tournament of the year; and with 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> as well as 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> places for Skipper of the year separated by one point and coming down to the last tournament of the year.

It is easy to say it was a great year of fishing. #### 2021 November Bass Slam Tournament

Saturday, November 6, 2021

The November Bass Slam was the last San Diego Anglers Tournament for 2021. The day started out a cool 59 degrees and light overcast. The day's temperature climbed up to 63 degrees and the sun came out about 11:00 AM, with a light wind in the afternoon of about 8 knots. For early November it was a really nice day to be on the water.

While there was not a huge turnout for the last tournament of the year, everyone that did enter turn in at least one fish at the weigh-in.

The Jackpot for the heaviest single fish went to our Junior Angler, Cash Troop, with a 3.9 lbs. Sand Bass. Congratulations, great job Cash! Cash was also the winner of our Junior Division, with a three-fish sack consisting of a 2.1-lb. Calico, a 1.3-lb. Spotted Bay Bass, and that big old 3.9-lb. Sand Bass.

As for the Adult Anglers, in third place, with a 2.8-lb. Sand Bass, winning \$18, is Frank Santiago. In second place, with a 3.4-lb. Sand Bass, winning \$30, and in first place with a two-fish sack weigh in at 4.1-lb., consisting of a 1-lb. Calico Bass and a 3.1-lbs. Sand Bass, winning \$60 is Tom Cash. 
event had a men's, ladies', and junior's category. The competition was fierce at times, with the winning overall cast being 335 feet, a record for this event!

#### Vagabond 10-Day Trip - October 2021

We have been doing this 10-day trip for almost 20 years, and every trip seems to be different, and this year was no exception. Captain Mike already had nice, cured sardines in the slammer from a previous trip, so all we had to do is fill the deck tanks and we were on our way. The weather was really bad at the Cortez and Tanner Banks, where the big bluefin tuna had been biting, so we pointed the nose toward Alijos Rocks instead and settled in for the 36-hour ride. As we traveled south, the weather definitely started to pick up, with lots of big rollers and wind behind us. By the time we reached the rocks, the weather had not improved and it was time to finally turn into the swell and start fishing. Hang on!

The target was wahoo, and we gave it a go for a couple of days out there, scratching out a decent catch of wahoo on trolled lures. Bombs and bait were not the hot ticket like last year! The sharks were eating our wahoo up pretty good, and it was time to make a move. Down to the Ridge we headed with another long boat ride in front of us with the weather improving by the hour. By the time we got there, it was flat calm like we are used to on this trip.

Now, here is what was different about this trip compared to any other ridge trip. All the fish we were targeting were on one spot, so we did not have to move, save for a little bit of wahoo trolling every morning before we would put the anchor back out mid morning and begin the onslaught. The yellowfin tuna would find us (25-40 lbers), and would attack the boat in waves, all day long. Mike told us that they would be available also after midnight on yoyo jigs if we wanted. During the day, yellows would swim under the boat along the bottom periodically and Mike would tell us to start vo-voing if we wanted. Then a few dorado would swim around the boat to make it interesting, then back to tuna. We were exhausted at the end of the first day but we thought we would try a little of the night fishing. What we started to catch was red snappers, juachinangos to the pangeros of Baja. They are excellent table fare, so we started to keep a few, not knowing the fishing would get better as the night went longer. Most of us went to bed and a few diehards stayed up to start catching the yellowfins when the midnight hour happened. They did not disappoint! This went on for about 3 days. Usually the boat is moving up and down the ridge over long distances looking for all these different types of fish, but this trip was one-stop shopping, giving us as much fishing as we wanted or could endure! The last night had no passengers fishing at all, just the deck hands Andrew and Tommy, catching YFT's all night long. We were tapped out!!

But we were not done yet. We still had Calico bass and beach yellowtail to catch, along with conducting our annual deckhand tournament. So in to the beach we went, hitting up a place called Santa Rosalito, a little spot north of Guerrero Negro. The fishing was just OK, so Mike headed north, hitting high spot after high spot, with the fishing getting better and better as we headed north. The calicos finally started to bite full speed and the yellows along with them. The bass rods were unsheathed, and we went to town having a blast catch both species. After we had our fill, it was time to hold our annual deck hand tournament. The passengers racked their rods, and Mike gave the crew 25 minutes to try and catch the largest yellow to win the \$320 we collected by passing the hat around. The deckhands are all excellent fisherman, and the fish started to come over the rail, with the help of Marina as the designated gaffer. She had never gaffed a fish before and was not thrilled about it, but she sucked it up and did a GREAT job at sticking the fish and putting them on the deck. So much that so Mike offered her a job when the fun was over!!! It looked like the galley crew was going to lose to the deckhands, but at the last minute Chowder the cook, caught his only fish on the last cast and beat the deck hands again by mere ounces!! Lots of ribbing will go on with the cooks winning 2 years in a row. Ouch!!

Up the beach we headed toward home with just a little bump that night on the water, cleaning up nicely as the morning sun rose. We had all day to talk about another wonderful trip as we sadly headed home. Many times I am asked by nonfisherman how we could live on a boat for 10 days. They look amazed as I tell them the time flies when you are on the water having so much fun with the fishing and friends. This year again was no exception as the 10 days were up in a flash! Thanks again to everyone who joined us on the trip and especially to Captain Mike and his great crew for giving us another memorable trip! Pictures on the next page.

We are starting to get questions from both club members and the public if the Open Bay Bass Tournament is going to happen for 2022. Sadly, the answer is no, but not for the reason that you think.

After a 30-minute talk with the Port of San Diego, they let us know that all attendances at all the events that they are hosting is down to 50% or less. That means our gross income for the event would be down drastically. She also told me that expenses are up about 15% for the events. Also, sponsorship is way down and normally we would be getting fishing gear to raffle off, but that stuff is just not available yet in the quantity we need to be successful. No raffle prizes means no money. Bottom line is that a lot of work would be done, taking months to do, and the club could possibly lose a lot of money by trying to put it on. We do not want to work for nothing, so we are going to wait another year to put on the Open Bay Bass Tournament.


