Vagabond 10 Day Trip OCT 19-29 2015 by Dwayne Patenaude

With one of the strongest El Niño's in history happening, the 16 of us gathered on the Vagabond with much anticipation. Wahoo, Blue marlin, short billed spearfish were all being caught right outside the harbor entrance just a few miles! We joked that maybe Captain Mike would spend the whole trip right off San Diego but we knew that he had a great trip planned for us down south. We finished the necessary chores (Food and bait) and Mike pointed the nose of the Vagabond south to familiar waters. We gathered in the galley after Mike contacted all of his code group to get the latest fishing info. Lots of Wahoo he said with just a little bit of yellows and school tuna down in the normal fishing areas. That was fine with us as we absolutely love the adrenalin rush of Wahoo fishing! We decided to go to Alijos Rocks to chase the wily Wahoo. They did not disappoint as it seemed like the Wahoo were everywhere that Mike went. I know one thing, we must have practiced losing Wahoo in the off season as we were experts at it! The count was not what it should have been but when your with friends, it doesn't matter as we talked in excited voices as we moved from school to school trying to figure these escape artists out. I joked at one point that God must really love Wahoo as he sure has given them plenty of tools to get off the hook to freedom! We ended the exciting day by anchoring up in 250' of water and waiting for the great night bite that Mike had told us about. 100lb test, dropper loops with 12 oz of lead was being readied as we went to bed and just like clockwork, the yellows started to bite at 3 am. Those vellows sure can pull hard when the skies are dark, the coffee is brewing and the smell of bacon is coming from the galley getting ready for Craig's breakfast in a few hours! We did much better with the yellowtail fishing and when the sun came back up, the yellows stopped biting and a tired, sore bunch racked our rods. Some of us slipped back off to bed, but it did not last very long as Mike found the Wahoo again and we repeated the day, but with better luck. We honed our skills and eventually got everyone onboard a Wahoo.

The routine went on for 3 days except for when Mike took us to the bank 10 miles to the southwest of the rocks to poke around a little bit. After an hour of traveling, just as we climbed up into the shallow, the troll rods went off and the Wahoo stormed the boat. They were everywhere! But as we reeled the fish to the boat, large brown images started to appear from the depths. Sharks and lots of them!! Those that were lucky enough to elude the teeth of the Wahoo and keep the fish hooked up, were not so lucky with the teeth of the sharks. They also stormed the boat and made short work of the struggling Wahoo as they gobbled them up as fast as we could get them to the boat. Quite exciting actually as we got to see the raw power of the shark as Earls Wahoo was eaten in one bite as a hiding shark zoomed out from under the Vagabond and ate his fish in one bite as it was getting ready to be gaffed! This same scenario happened a few more times in the next couple of hours before Mike pulled the plug and went back to the Rocks!



We then ventured down to the ridge where we got a call from the Spirit of Adventure that he found a large school of Wahoo (Damn the bad luck again!) and he needed some help in the harvest. We were more than happy to oblige as we were now all skilled Wahoo fisherman and we were ready to practice our craft on a new school! We were not disappointed and we steadily started catching Wahoo and many of us were approaching our Mexican limit. Mike is very good about keeping an accurate count of the fish as it is dropped in the well, letting everyone who got a limit that they were done. We did this for a couple of days, looked at our calendar and begrudgingly pointed the boat toward home. We tried to catch some Yellowfin and Yellowtails on the way home but the El Nino hot water (81-84 degrees) had them elsewhere.

We had only one more thing to do as we traveled and that was to find some decent fishing to have our crew fishing tournament. Mike stopped at all the normal spots but the fish were not to be found. I actually thought that we might not have it, but guess what, and what a surprise, Mike found a willing school of yellows at San Martin and the game was on. We had heard throughout the trip who was going to win, with Kyle and John already trading friendly jabs on how they were going to spend their \$300 booty. But not a peep from Gordon the whole time. Fishing started and John and Kyle kept it interesting by heaving yellows on to the deck. Gordon stayed cool and calm under pressure as he was not catching anything, at least not like the other 2. We are down to the last 5 minutes and Kyle hooks a big yellow at about the same time Gordon does. The comments from the passenger peanut gallery are at an all time high, with many of the deckhands favorite sayings while the passengers are hooked up, are echoed back right at them. SHELTER ISLAND BOAT RAMP TO BE REBUILT IN 2017

The California Division of Boating and Waterways has awarded the Port of San Diego a \$6.1 million grant from the Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund for the Shelter Island Boat Launch Facility Improvements Project. The award was announced at the regular meeting of the Boating and Waterways Commission, which was held at the Port's Administration Building on November 18, 2015.

The grant will help fund the estimated \$9.5 million needed for the project. The project entails improving the launch ramp's basin by enlarging the maneuvering area, replacing the worn-out launch ramp, increasing the lengths of the boarding floats, providing a concrete drop-off area for kayaks, and bringing the restroom to current ADA (Americans with Disability Act) standards.

This is a dedicated, public boat launch facility providing the closest access in the region to the Pacific Ocean and to the Coronado Islands. It's the most popular boat launch in San Diego Bay with nearly 50,000 boat launches a year. However, this is a heavily congested facility that needs improvement. The facility is used by recreational boaters from the general public. Small yachts, inboard and out-board motorboats, private fishing boats, fishing tournament boats and amphibious tour buses all compete for space at the popular launch ramp and its basin.

When completed, the new launch facility basin will be 82 percent larger. The new entry/exit point will increase from its current 25 feet to 60 feet. New walkways and public viewing platforms will be added and a separate area for hand-launched watercraft will be added.

Along with the Division of Boating and Waterways grant, the Port anticipates receiving \$3.35 million in funding from the Wildlife Conservation Board. The Wildlife Conservation Board has determined that the Shelter Island Boat Launch Facility project is aligned with its mission and has informed the Division of Boating and Waterways of its intention to provide funding to support construction of the project.

Construction is anticipated to take place between December 2016 and December 2017. The Port will host a public outreach event early in 2016 to educate the boating community about the project and to inform the public of alternative locations of nearby boat launching facilities to be used during construction.

LOBSTER HOOPING TOURNAMENT



Tournament channel 68

December 19, 2015

- 1. The official starting time of the tournament is 4:00 P.M. on SATURDAY, December 19, 2015. The official ending time of the tournament is 11:00 P.M. on SATURDAY ,December 19, 2015.
- 2. Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. No tournament hooping is allowed before the official tournament starting time.
- 3. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be SAN DIEGO BAY. Tournament fishing may be done from any platform.
- 4. Bait may be caught, purchased or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
- 5. California Department of Fish & Game regulations apply. No exceptions. Rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for knowing California regulations.
- 6. Transferring of anglers and lobsters from a disabled boat is allowed to comply with rule #7 or to retrieve nets.
- 7. Anglers must report in person with the Tournament Weighmaster with bugs ready for weighing no later than the official ending time of the tournament.
- 8. Heaviest 3 Lobster Sack Per Team. Spiny Lobster will count. (There will be a \$10.00 Team Jackpot for the heaviest single Spider Crab or lobster if no crab are caught.) All lobster must be weighed in at the San Diego Anglers Tournament Weigh Station located at the Shelter Island Launch Ramp on the club scale between 10:00 P.M. and 11:00 P.M.
- 9. Prize Categories: Heaviest Three Lobster Sack 1st, 2nd and 3rd per team (Boat). There will be no ties in any of the prize categories. When two sacks of the same weight are presented, the first sack presented is considered the winner.
- 10. If a small craft advisory is issued prior to the official start time the day of the event, the tournament will be considered canceled. If issued after the official start time all fishing will stop. It is the angler's responsibility to monitor radios and/or the National Weather Service for this report. All lobster caught prior to that time are eligible in the final standings. Lobster must be weighed in prior to the official ending time of the tournament
- 11. All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a Tournament Entry Form, Release of Liability Statement and Boat Insurance Certificates by 4 PM Saturday, December 19, 2015.
