Tommy Gomes, as the son of a commercial fisherman, was part of a **Portuguese fishing family** that settled here in 1892. His uncles were the adventurous and rugged pioneers of the American tuna fleet, and Tommy, as a youth, tied into that heritage. "Growing up around boats as my father and



brothers were all fishermen, is how I got my start: working on vessels as a galley boy, sports boats as a pinhead, and then working my way through the ranks and into the pilothouse on commercial vessels."

Gomes, who has long been the public face of Catalina Offshore Products, will no longer be involved in the wholesaler's day-to-day operations. During his 15-year tenure with the company, Gomes led the development of Catalina's walk-in fish market and founded Collaboration Kitchen, a nonprofit dinner series. Going Solo as **Tommy the Fishmonger®**, he will explore new projects and continue his advocacy work related to the sustainable seafood industry. He will still act as an ambassador and chef liaison for Catalina Offshore while building an independent consulting business that will work with restaurants, markets, and other organizations through cooking demos, educational classes, speaking engagements, and having his own show on the Outdoor Channel, "The Fishmonger."



San Diego Anglers Foundation-Pro Kids, First Tee, Fishing Trip

The Foundation was contacted by Christine from ProKids out of City Heights and asked us if we could take a bunch of kids fishing on a half-day trip. "Of course we can," we told her as we had just received a large check from ex-clubmember Matt Green, who now lives in Florida. He asked us to take some kids fishing, and coincidently, Christine's call came a week later.

We chartered the "New Seaforth" for the afternoon of Thursday, August 19th, with Captain Julio at the helm. He takes us twilight fishing and knows our group very well and what we are about: Having Fun!! We contacted Chad and JoJo at Hookup Baits and asked them to help sponsor the kids fishing trip by putting someone on board and to supply lures for the afternoon.. "Calico" Frank showed up to do the honors, and away we went up to our favorite spot off La Jolla. Club President Ray joined us, with many volunteers from the club also helping, including Kevin Bayne taking the photos. Hookup Baits were tied on the 45 rods and after a brief stop on the way up, we went to the "San Diego Anglers' Fishing Hole" off La Jolla. Conditions were perfect, with no wind and the current pushing into the beach. Captain Julio said this was the first time all year that he has seen the current going in his favorite direction. It was looking real good for an epic trip!!

It took a few minutes of chumming, but the Calico bass showed up in force as they followed the chum back to the boat and the kids had a great time jacking Calicos into the boat. Also, be aware of any specific SDA tournament rules that may require your weight receipt to be submitted sooner than the 30-day rule for a standard weight receipt. The San Diego Anglers only accepts this online weight receipt or the official paper version of the San Diego Anglers Official Weight Receipt. No other weight receipts from other clubs are acceptable. The paper version of the weight-receipt is located in the forms section of our website at http://www.SanDiegoAnglers.com.

2021 August All Species Tournament

Well, it was a great three weeks of fishing, August 1st thru the 22nd. We had 18 anglers signed up for the tournament. Of the anglers, 5 were juniors, who all turned in qualifying fish weight receipts. There were 13 Adults: 3 women, and 10 men. All the women also turned in qualifying fish weight receipts, with 2 of the women being prize winners, and one of those women is our big winner. We had 5 of the men turned in qualifying weight receipts.

There was a total of 39 weight receipts turned in, ranging in point scores from 20.0 points (4lbs. dorado) to 220.0 points (63.0 lbs. Bluefin Tuna). I will tell you that most of the receipts came in in the last week of the tournament. So, what can we take away from this information: Most anglers do better under short time frames and the women and juniors are outfishing the men...?

In looking at the weight receipts turned in, the fishing (more importantly the catching) took place all over the place: from north of the north end of the 9-mile bank, the 209, the coast, the bay, and out at the Islands. The fish were caught from the docks, kayaks, private boats, and party boats. So, it looks like it is wide open for catching fish.

Remember the Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament has already started (August 1st) and was running in conjunction with the All-Species Tournament. We have had a couple of our anglers already turn in multiple measurement receipts for this tournament. However, there is plenty of time to get out there and catch the winning fish. The Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament goes on through Sunday, September 26th, 2021.

- 1. The official starting time of the tournament is 06:00 am on Sunday, August 1, 2021. The official ending time of the tournament is 5:00 pm on Sunday, September 26, 2021. THIS WILL BE A FORK MEASURMENT RULE TOURNAMENT.
- Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time. All club tournaments are operated on an honor system.
- 3. The fishing areas of the tournament shall be limited to those waters of the Pacific Ocean within 125 miles of San Diego.
- 4. During the tournament, fishing can be done from any fishing platform, including kayaks, private or sportfishing boats.
- 5. Bait may be caught, purchased, or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used, or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
- 6. IGFA angling rules will be used for this tournament. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance with all California or Mexican fishing and boating laws and regulations, as applicable.
- All fish entries photos must be e-mailed to <u>lindseysj@aol.com</u> with an email date/time of no later than 6:00 PM, Sunday, September 26, 2021. Late entries will not be accepted. There must be 2 photos per fish:

First Photo: Shall show the whole fish and the angler's name printed legibly with the measuring device across the side of the fish so as the see the overall length of the fish.

Second Photo: Shall be of the same fish, this time of the "Y" of tail section of the fish so as to be able to read the length of the fish to the nearest 1/8".

Photos that are not in focus enough to be properly read will not be accepted. You will be notified as soon as the photos are reviewed if they are not acceptable.

- 8. Eligible Species: Tuna (Yellow or Bluefin), Dorado, and Yellowtail. Entrants can submit multiple submittals, only the largest single fish of each specie will be counted for that angler.
- 9. Prizes will be awarded in the following categories: **Tuna Class, Dorado Class, Yellowtail Class** 1st, 2nd, 3rd place for adults; 1st, 2nd, and 3rd for juniors. There will be no ties in any category. When two entries of the same length are submitted, the first fish submitted (based on the date/time stamp on the email) will be considered the winner.
- 10. <u>Bonus Class</u>: There will be <u>NO additional fee</u> for this Bonus Class. It will be based on a 3-fish sack for total overall length. All anglers entered in the tournament (Adults & Juniors) with a 3-fish sack will automatically be entered in the Bonus Class.
- 11. Tournament awards will be presented at the club BBQ / Earl Asbury Memorial salute on October 3, 2021
- 12. All anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
- 13. All tournament anglers must complete, sign, and submit a <u>Tournament Entry Form</u> and a <u>COPY OF THEIR CURRENT BOAT</u> <u>INSURANCE POLICY</u> prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament. Entrants may sign up any time prior to the tournament starting date and time. The entry forms must be turned in to the locations or persons listed on the back of this form. All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing or non-members fishing as a guest of a club member. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info (if applicable), and date/time stamp. By signing the application, Applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
- 14. Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
- 15. Tournament Angler of the Year and Skipper points will be awarded for this tournament based on class results.

PROTESTS

- 1. The Protest Committee will be made up of:
 - a. Sam Lindsey
 - b. Larry Courtney
 - c. Ray Broadfoot

2. The Protest Committee has the right to disqualify any angler who exhibits unsportsmanlike conduct.

3. Any protest relative to the length/weight of a fish, manner of measuring/weighing, or the manner of catching/landing the fish must be made prior to the notification of placement in the tournament or the fish being removed from the scale. The protest must be made to the Tournament Weighmaster and Tournament Director at that time.

4. Any protest, except weight, must be filed in writing with the Protest Committee no later than 24 hours after the ending time of the tournament. The protest may be filed with any member of the Protest Committee.


Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament Measurement Rule Information

The 2021 Earl Asbury Memorial Tournament will be an 8-week event under the SDA Measurement Rule.

- All anglers MUST BE signed up PROIR TO FISHING. All entry forms must be sent in before 6:00 AM the date of the event
- All fish MUST BE of legal size to be scored, even if the fish is released. The fish must be photographed against the measuring device as depicted in the diagram below.
- All fish must be measured the same way: with the fish lying on its side, on a flat surface. The '0' end of the soft tape at the nose/closed mouth of the fish. The soft tape measure shall be pulled taut (No wrinkles) and run the side centerline of the fish to the "Y" of the tail.
- The <u>photos</u> of the catch MUST BE IN FOCUS. <u>First Photo</u> shall show the whole fish, with a clear view of the zero end of the tape is on the nose/closed mouth and where the soft tape measure comes to on the "Y" of the tail and the Angler's Name. The Angler's Name may be written on an index card or the back of your hand, either way it must be legible. <u>Second Photo</u> shall be of the "Y" of the tail so as to be able to easily read the soft tape measuring device to the nearest 1/8".
- <u>The Photos and Measurement Rule Tournament Fish Report form</u> (Fill out completely for <u>each species</u> being entered. Example: Three species, three forms and 6 photos) must be e-mailed to <u>lindseysj@aol.com</u> before the closing deadline, 6:00 PM on Sunday, September 26, 2021.
- All lengths will be determined/confirmed by the tournament director based on photo sent in.

HOW TO MEASURE FORK LENGTH OF CATCH

The **total length** is the maximum length of the fish, from the nose/closed mouth to the "Y" of the tail. With the fish laying on its side, on a flat surface, place the Zero end of a soft tape measure at the nose/closed mouth. Pull a flexible tape taut (no wrinkles), measure along the side centerline/curve of the fish to the farthest section of "Y" of the tail.
